



The following document outlines the responses we have had from the Parental Questionnaires that were completed during Parent's Evening on the 13th November 24. 151 families completed the form and were able to share their views with us. Any names or other information that can be used to identify the child have been removed from the results.

Does your child feel safe at school?



Pupil safety is paramount and all of our staff are trained annually in safeguarding, in line with Keeping Children Safe in Education. We have four Designated Senior Leaders; Mrs Green, Mrs Slater, Mrs Giles and Miss Killeen, all of whom are skilled in dealing with safeguarding issues and liaising with other agencies. Through our curriculum and assemblies, we are able to deliver age-appropriate safeguarding sessions. We have strong links with multi-agency professionals who support us with any situations that arise. As seen here the overwhelming majority of our pupils feel safe whilst they are at school.


Lea Community Primary School Response to parental questionnaire feedback — October 24 Do you feel school encourages good behaviour from all children?



We have high expectations with regard to behaviour throughout school. School has an effective Relational policy in place, which is reviewed annually and shared regularly with children. A child friendly version of our Relational Policy is available as a PowerPoint and is shared with children annually. The majority of parents feel that our school encourages good behaviour from all children. In addition to this parents were keen to recognise and acknowledge how much they resonate with our school values and how much the children relate to them and bring them home.




Do you feel bullying is dealt with effectively at our school?



All stakeholders are well aware that bullying is unacceptable within our school. We have an anti-bullying policy in place and children are taught strategies on what to do if they feel that they or another child is being bullied. All of our children, are encouraged to have 5 trusted adults who they can speak to about any worries they have with friendships. We take part annually with the national anti-bullying week and share our learning together in special assemblies. For children who are encountering friendship issues within school, Mrs Green can support with this. If you feel that your child is experiencing difficulties with friendships or relationships or being bullied, then please do come and speak to one of our school team at the earliest convenience.




Do you feel that school keeps you up to date with what your child is learning?



Learning evenings are held at the start of every year for you to engage with your child's class teacher and find out about curriculum coverage and expectations for the year. Curriculum overviews with details of all curriculum learning are produced each half term and are available on our school website. Further sessions are held throughout the year to support parents, in supporting learning at home in English and Maths. Parents' evenings are held twice a year and a written report is shared with parents at the end of the academic year too. In KS1, we have adopted an enquiry based learning approach where different aspects of curriculum learning are taught and are present within classroom areas throughout the week. This includes an area of child initiated learning. Parents and children are consulted when any areas of the curriculum are being reviewed. These outcomes are reflected upon and integrated into future curriculum planning. The majority of parents are happy with how well they are kept in the loop with their child's learning. Their comments reflect on how much they appreciate the Dojo app we have in place and how much they appreciate and enjoy seeing the teachers' updates.




Do you feel that any concerns you raise are dealt with appropriately?



Any concerns that you have over your child's education or well-being should be brought to the class teacher's attention at the earliest convenience in order for any worries or concerns to be 'nipped in the bud.' If you feel that you would rather speak to myself or another member of the SLT then please do feel free to catch one of us before or after school, ring the school office or email: contact@leacp.lancs.sch.uk and we can arrange a meeting at the earliest convenience. If you do have any concerns or are worried about anything that has happened that has caused distress and upset to the family, please do come and speak to us. Mrs Green is skilled in offering family and parenting support in a whole range of issues including bereavement. If you are not happy with how your concern has been dealt with then we do have a complaints procedure which is available on the school website or from the school office. The majority of parents who responded to the parental questionnaires were happy with how any concerns they have raised have been dealt with, be that via the teachers, senior leadership team or office. Several parents have never had to raise concerns whilst their children have attended Lea Community Primary.




Do you feel we, as a school, have high expectations for your child?




Do you feel your child does well at school?



Every child is regularly assessed from Reception. This is closely monitored by Senior Leadership and pupil progress meetings are held termly with each class teacher. Any child who is underachieving receives intervention, including same day intervention to support their identified area of need. Quality feedback in all areas of the curriculum allows children to edit and revise work, reflecting on mistakes and correcting these.

Lea Community Primary School Response to parental questionnaire feedback — October 24 Do you feel you are kept up to date with your child's progress?



We offer two formal parents evenings per year and an informal end of year open day. During the formal evenings, parents are able to sit down and discuss their child's successes and targets in all areas of the curriculum. A written report is also sent home at the end of the year to showcase your child's success in their learning followed by an informal open evening to celebrate the achievements of the children throughout the year. If at any time throughout the year you feel that you would like to discuss your child's progress further or pop in and have a look at your child's books, then please do feel free to make an appointment.




Do you feel school offers a wide range of extra-curricular clubs and opportunities for your child?



Our dedicated staff team offer an exciting and comprehensive range of extra-curricular clubs throughout the year to all children in school that enrich and extend curriculum learning. These are held during lunchtimes, after school and before school. We also have many opportunities for sport and performance within school and the local community. Our children's hard work and talents within some of these clubs are showcased at our termly 'Performing Arts Assembly' and within inter-school competitions and events held at various venues including MEN arena, Burnley Mechanics Theatre, Blackburn Cathedral and within our immediate and wider community. We also strive to ensure our children are given opportunities to visit and experience theatre performances and professional sporting events to develop their cultural capital. Our educational visits, which support curriculum learning, are hands on experiences and opportunities that each and every child in school has access to. Extra-curricular clubs have been very popular once again this year and the parental questionnaire has highlighted that the majority of parents are happy with the range of clubs offers. In the Autumn term, EYFS do not start clubs whilst they settle into school life.
